*We* beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 15th inst. ~~we are~~ extremely sorry to learn that you do not consider our final bill. In ~~reporting~~ <sup>presenting</sup> this bill we, of course, considered what we thought was only fair and just and what we were entitled to and when Mr. Marsten was at our office we discussed the matter with him as we were anxious to close the matter without any further distress or humiliation.

While we were connected with the Exposition we endeavored to give you the best advice that we were able to. We were enthusiastically interested, not only in the Exposition but especially in the future of your park and we were practically giving free advice when we prepared detailed planting plans and grading plans and other construction plans for your park, such plans not being included when we made the agreement to prepare plans for the Exposition and a general plan for the park. We were called upon to spend considerable extra time in arguing for the southern site of the Exposition. This was purely in behalf of the Park Department. We were obliged to pay the expenses of Mr. Blossom's return <sup>trip and as agreed upon</sup> to us. We also felt that we were entitled to payment for our services up to the time of our unavoidable ~~and most unpleasant~~ resignation, in proport-

tion to our agreed upon compensation.

We feel that we are entitled to the payment of this bill but if you question the portion of the bill that is for comepnasation for our services, we will be willing to abide by the opinion of Mr. Marsten, ~~but we~~ <sup>however</sup> expect that the portion of the bill for expenses will be paid regardless of Mr. Marsten's opinion as to the rest of it.
