Ready to Ratify Agreement If It Is Shown to Be Economical.

or the exposition directors with the former park commission providing the agreement is shown to be advantageous to the city. However, the present commission insists that it has not been convinced of the advisability of ratifying the contract.

"So far we have found the division of works contract to be an extravasant arrangement," says the statement, which is as follows:

"The real point of contention between the exposition company and the park commission is the division of works contract. The officials of the exposition company demand an immediate ratification of that contract. The park commission, feeling the weight of their responsibility to the people, want time to give-the contract proper consideration. If it is a good contract, if the contract will save money for the commission and therefore for the people, we are willing to ratify it. If it is not a good contract it is an extravargant contract, we will not accept it in any way or under any condition. not accept it in any way or under any condition.


