- 1. Dimensions of the Palenque Cross, which is moxed and set outside in the Museum loft to be shipped to us.
- 2. Dimensions of the Tikal Tablet in the Central American Hall.
- 3. Dimensions of the tablets from the piers at the entrance to the Palenque Sanctuary. (See cut opposite page 354, volume 2, (Stephens "Incidents of Travel in Central (America, Chiapas and Yucatan"). I believe the Museum has casts of these, and I have asked Mr. Holmes if he will allow you to make casts for me from those and the Tikal Tablet, using the glue process.
- 4. Dimensions of the Tablet from the Palenque Sanctuary, which is shown in the frontispiece of the same work of Stephens. I believe you have a cast of that in the Museum, and if so, I want a cast made from that also.

Will you kindly get these dimensions out for me at once and send them on. You might take it upon yourself to jog Mr. Holmes about the permission to make the casts.
