My dear Mr. Holmes:

Our first carload of material from the National Museum is in and unloaded, and so far as we can tell from the outside of the boxes, everything came through in fine shape. I am now greatly in need of the rest of the Central American material and for that reason I should be glad if you would push the second car out just as soon as possible, including in it all of the Central American models, panels, etc.

I find the interior work not yet ready for me, and so the beginning of installation will have to be delayed awhile. I think, however, that so far as your program is concerned, it may go just about as you had planned it when I was in Washington. I will consider it a great favor, and I am sure it will go far to support the work that we have tried to develop here, if you will permit us to announce you for a lecture before the San Diego branch of the Institute. As it appears now, I should say that the best time for your lecture would be the middle of November - it could be placed a little later, if that would suit you better. It should be an illustrated lecture, and I know that you are well furnished with slides representing the art and architecture of Central America. Please let me know by return mail if you can do this, and suggest a title. I want to advertise this well in advance and give you a big turnout.
