My dear Olmstead;-

I was much interested in your letter in regard to the San Diego exposition. If Los Angeles people are interested in favor of it, as I suppose they are, you could not do better than get Charles F. Lummis to be your local aid and helper. He knows the Southwest as well as any man, and is enthusiastic in regard to the Indians. The man here in the East who knows most about the house plans etc etc is J. W. Fewkes, at the Bureau of Ethnology.

For detailed plans of villages etc, the reports of the Bureau of Ethnology are I think, the best, for the Pueblo people and cliff-dwelling sites. The volumes for the following years contain most information;- Reports as follows, 3", 13", 15", 16", 19", 22", Bulletin 41. Fewkes can give you a mass of information, if you can get a chance to talk to him.

I shall be very glad to talk over the matter with you here any time before Xmas, except the end of next week when I shall be in Washington. If you come over to lunch here any day, or 'phone me I am free usually in the afternoon. So far as I know Monday and Tuesday next week are wholly free in the P.M. You can get me at Cambridge 2666 any time Saturday morning.
