I think as far as the Heater and the tank and the burner is con. it is o.k. and very likely the extras are too — as he probably didn't include any of them in his estimate —

Richardson may be able to throw some light on it — They seem to make a charge of 25<sup>00</sup> for installing it —

I think you ought to have an itemized bill of the extras — and then check them up — at the green house — also ask them to state what they included in the installation of the heater and at their expense point out to you on the ground the extra fittings and the fittings included in the installation of the heater —
