My dear Miss Bullard,

Thank you for your letter

of 8th. June and for check for \$37 ⁹⁴/₁₀₀ - I am glad you understand the way of charging the same as I do. One month like May, will have 192 hours, and June will have 192 also, July 180 hrs; so each one is likely to vary and Mr J Co. figured the \$1.12 rate on a year's time by weeks of 44 hrs. each less holidays.

Mr. J Co. is evidently; from a telegram received by Mr. Gill, leaving Seattle to-day or to-morrow. Mr. Gill is going on a trip east leaving here June 16th. for Chicago, then on the 21st. also again the 28th. Syracuse 30th. N.Y. City July 1st & 2nd. Mr. Dawson wishes Mr. Harper to meet Mr. Gill hoping some good might come of it for the Andorra job, architecturally, and he has asked me to write Mr. Harper regarding his meeting Mr. Gill on this trip of Mr. Gill's.

He has also asked me to give Mr. Gill a letter to Mr. Harper - I tell you this so that you will be fully informed. Mr. Dawson has always been anxious to influence the architecture of the Audover work towards the Spanish style which Mr. Gill handles in a form adapted to American ways of living.

The situation here is still tangled and we are doing no work - We still hope it will get straightened out. People of some standing here all think that the contracts with Olmsted Brothers, Goodhue, and Allen cannot be broken and so must finally be recognized by the new administration. But it keeps us in a state of uncertainty which is unpleasant in the extreme.

My regards to old friends at home.

We are all well, and Betty is putting words together now which adds to the interest each day.

What dreadful hot weather the last round state have been having. Here it runs up to 70-74 at midday and down to 50-54 at night; but always a breeze and the sky often cloud blanketed which makes it very comfortable.
