I sincerely hope that you will use every effort to keep the exposition at the south end of the park and not in the middle. It will be a great pity to destroy the purposes of the park by cutting out the very heart of it with an ex-position especially with permanent buildings. The beauty and value of Balboa Park now is its grandeur, in its breadth of unbroken natural features free from artificial features, especially within its bounds. Your park is for park purposes and not to be used as a setting and frame to a group of buildings. It certainly will be an injustice to the public and a tremendous sacrifice if this is done.
