From a park point of view it is decidedly important to keep the exposition at the south end of the park instead of middle. Buildings other than for park purposes have no right to be placed in a park. It was that reason that ~~Mr~~ Olmsted urged your commissions to keep the exposition at the south end of park. It will practically permanently mar the beauty and purposes of the park to allow ~~the~~ exposition to be located elsewhere than at the south end and I beg of you in behalf of the people who most need the park and who are unable to go to the country for real rest and happiness to use your influence in keeping the exposition at the south end. The permanent buildings will then become a part of the city and the remaining park will be undisturbed.
