San Diego Welcomes Our Visiting Chiefs

N September 30th, 1891, a few Chiefs gathered together at Victoria, B. C., to form an organization for the purpose of discussing subjects relating to Fire Protection and Fire Prevention. This was the initial meeting of what is now known as the Pacific Coast Association of Fire Chiefs. Since that time, meetings have been held in various cities, with more or less attendant success.

At an early period in the life of the Association, interest was at a low ebb, during which time, progress was greatly retarded.

A reorganization was effected at Seattle in 1898, and the enthusiasm created at this meeting eventually culminated in the present highly organized and successful Association, the 24th Annual Convention of which is now in session at San Diego, the "Harbor of the Sun," the extreme Southern meeting place of the Association.

The honor conferred upon us through this distinction is deeply sensed. We are justly proud of this occasion, and grateful for the opportunity which it affords of welcoming you to our city.

With the kind assistance of the manufacturers whose names appear in this Program, we have been enabled to make arrangements for what we sincerely trust will prove to be a most successful Convention, and we believe that every Chief will return to his home feeling that his time has been well spent, and that his city will derive great benefit through the additional knowledge which he has acquired.

THE San Diego Fire Department organized under City Ordinance, December 9th, 1886, almost 30 years ago, was then a Volunteer Department consisting of hand-drawn apparatus, whose Chief received the lucrative salary of \$25.00 per month.

Two years later, in 1887, an important acquisition was made by the purchase of a horse drawn steamer and hose wagon, and the employment of an engineer and driver to operate same.

In August, 1899, it was reorganized as a 'partially paid' department; engineers and drivers being regularly employed, other members of the various companies receiving a small compensation for their services, when called upon to respond to fire alarms.

intendent of Fire Alarms and Police Telegraph. He has been affiliated with the Fire Department for almost fourteen years, having been appointed callman in October, 1902; promoted to driver in 1903, advanced to Engineer in 1905, and appointed Chief Engineer three and one-half years later, which position he has fixed successfully and continuously to the present date.

Under his efficient guidance the San Diego Fire Department has advanced along scientific lines, until it now consists of fifteen stations, all equipped with modern motor propelled apparatus, a well equipped drill tower and 105 men. An additional station will be erected and a new fire tug placed in commission this year.

A modern machine shop where all of the department repair work is done, has also been established, a Relief Pension Fund has been founded, and work along Fire Prevention lines has been developed.
