

SAN DIEGO READY TO RECEIVE ROOSEVELT

Public Reception and Banquet Will Be Tendered Naval Secretary.

LUNCHEON AT CORONADO

Cruise on Bay Feature of Entertainment Planned For Visitors.

Final arrangements have been completed for the reception of Franklin D. Roosevelt, assistant secretary of the navy, who, in company with his wife, will arrive in San Diego today. W. Jefferson Davis left yesterday to meet Roosevelt in Los Angeles and, conduct him to this city. The party will arrive at 7 o'clock this morning, when they will be met by Lieutenant Commander Davis of the navy, and a committee from the Chamber of Commerce.

Mr. and Mrs. Roosevelt will be conducted by automobile to the home of Lieutenant Davis, where they will be guests during their visit here. At 9 o'clock Roosevelt will be met by a delegation in automobiles and shown over the Exposition grounds. He will have the honor of being the first man to cross the new bridge in an automobile. After an inspection of the fair grounds the party will visit the naval coaling station at La Playa, the wireless and Point Loma. Mrs. Roosevelt will not accompany her husband in the morning, but will attend the dinner service at the St. Paul's Episcopal Church.

1915 EXPOSITION SEAL RARE WORK OF ART

Designed for Use in Attracting Visitors to San Diego



Symbolic Seal to Be Used in Publicity Campaign for Panama-California Exposition at San Diego in 1915. Its Originator and Beautiful Young Woman Who Posed for Central Figure in Design. At Left, Miss Vona Burnette-Taber, Great-Granddaughter of California's First Governor, Peter H. Burnett, Who Posed for Central Figure of Liberty. In Center, Seal Reproductions of Which Will Go to Every Civilized Land on Postals and Posters. At Right, A. de Lisle-Holland, Artist Who Created Design, at Work Upon It.

Art. allegory and altruism are ingeniously arranged in the design and execution of the handsome 1915 Exposition seal, which is nearing completion in the studio of Charles A. de Lisle-Holland, 1239 Fifth street. This seal is a beautiful creation, painted as a study in black and white, and to be used in the position of official seal in connection with a world-wide publicity campaign for attracting attendance at the San Diego 1915 Exposition.

Creator and Donor of Symbolic Study in White and Black Explains Allegory and Predicts Record Attendance At Panama-California Fair.

The seal design is encircled by a broad band inclosed in heavy rope. On one hand is the inscription, "Panama-California Exposition, 1915." The rope is used to surround the seal, symbolizing the binding together of the two oceans and the commerce of the world. The rope is used also because it is an integral part in all shipping ventures. Unification is the central idea of the Panama Canal.

Miss Vona Burnette-Taber of Pasadena, painted the central figure of the seal, which is a study in black and white. She has often been a guest in San Diego and Coronado at many exclusive social events. She was born at Santa Ana and has been a lifelong resident of this state. Because she was a native daughter, a descendant of the first governor of California, and a woman of surpassing beauty, it was felt that she should be the central figure of the seal.

Holland explains the allegory of his design as follows: "Liberty, the central figure, is depicted on the pedestal standing in the center of the Culcra cut of the Panama canal, holding an abalone shell in her right hand. The shell on the left. From these shells a stream of water is shown falling into the canal, expressing the mingling through the canal of the waters of the Pacific and Atlantic oceans."

Dentist Disclaims Control of Patient's Gustatory Portions

Bridge Gives Way and Is Swallowed; \$5000 Damage Suit Follows.

A. H. Nickerson filed suit against Parker in April of last year, claiming that bridgework put in by the dentist worked loose and that he swallowed it. He stated that he called on the dentist for advice and was told to go to a doctor. The doctor located the bridge with an X-ray and, after it was taken out, Nickerson claimed that he was unable to eat, or sleep or lie down with comfort.
